Launched in 2012 and part of Greater Montreal's economic development strategy, the Metropolitan Cluster of logistics and transportation in Montreal, CargoM, complements the clusters that have been deployed in recent years.

With the St. Lawrence flowing at its feet, Montréal has long been considered a major entryway for international trade in North-East America.

Offering direct access to 135 million North American consumers within a 1,000 km radius, Montréal and its port has been an essential intermodal transportation hub for decades.

Evidently, cargo transportation is a crucial component of Montréal's economy, and is equally important to the entire metropolitan area. The cargo and logistics industry represents 122,000 direct and indirect jobs, 6,300 establishments and 142 million tons of merchandise. Over 70% of these jobs are located on the island of Montréal.

We are overjoyed with the 2017-2018 report, characterized by fluidity, economic development and outreach! These words express the objectives of the Cluster and support the positioning of Greater Montreal as a cargo transport hub and gateway to North America.

Our Cluster makes the economic development of Greater Montreal a priority for the coming years. In recent months, we had the opportunity to meet with several foreign organizations to discuss logistics and transportation issues around the world. We followed through on these exchanges by presenting our hub's many advantages at world-class conferences such as Cargo Logistics Canada, by hosting delegations and by participating in workshops organized to develop international expertise and relationships. This year, CargoM had a chance to meet experts from Germany, France, Belgium, the United Kingdom and the United States.

Highlights

Our hub's competitiveness and our industry members' outreach are still at the heart of the Cluster's activities, and are reinforced by CargoM's participation on several advisory committees dedicated to Greater Montreal's economic development. CargoM is particularly recognized and appreciated by the Board of Directors of Conseil Emploi Métropole, the Advisory Committee on the Sustainable Mobility Policy of the Quebec Ministry of Transport, Sustainable Mobility and Transportation Electrification (MTMDET), the Advisory Committee of Mobilité Montréal, the Transport Committee of Chamber of Commerce of Metropolitan Montreal (CCMM) and the Industrial Port Zone Committees of Montreal, Contrecœur-Varennes and Sainte-Catherine. In addition, CargoM is pleased to contribute as partner to the success of the SCALE.Al super cluster on supply chains

powered by artificial intelligence. The latter was chosen from among the five super clusters selected by the federal government to stimulate research and innovation.

CargoM was also honoured last June with the Freight Transport Award at the AQTr Grand Prix of Excellence in Transportation Awards Gala. The project on measuring and improving the fluidity of truck transport was carried out in collaboration with CIRRELT (Interuniversity Research Centre on Enterprise Networks, Logistics and Transportation). Also pertaining to fluidity, which remains at the core of our actions, CargoM implemented technological tools to improve the flow of traffic in Greater Montreal, such as Cargo Mobile, Ottoview and SPI-LI.



The second edition of CargoM Career Days in Transportation and Logistics was a great success, with more than 1,500 participants, close to 50 booths and the presence of Minister for Maritime Affairs Jean D'Amour. This event, which has become a staple for recruitment and promotion of careers in our industry, was made possible through the collaboration and support of Service Québec's regional department for the Island of Montreal. Lastly, to develop our understanding of our sector's needs and to orient actions at the workforce and training levels, CargoM, in concert with our partners, produced a white paper in 2017.

Several other projects are underway. As always, we are working on the fluidity, outreach and economic development of our logistics chain. To find out more about our current projects, please consult the pages in this report dedicated to our working groups.

We take this opportunity to thank the members of the Executive Committee and the Board of Directors, who all contribute very actively to the deployment and promotion of our Cluster. We steadfastly support of all our working group members, who participate in developing our orientations and actions alike. Lastly, we also thank the entire full-time team, which works exceptionally hard in a harmonious, dynamic environment that fosters creativity.

We also want to recognize our many members, who stayed with us again this year, and the donors who support us financially and whose contributions make it possible to bring our projects to life and achieve our goals.
